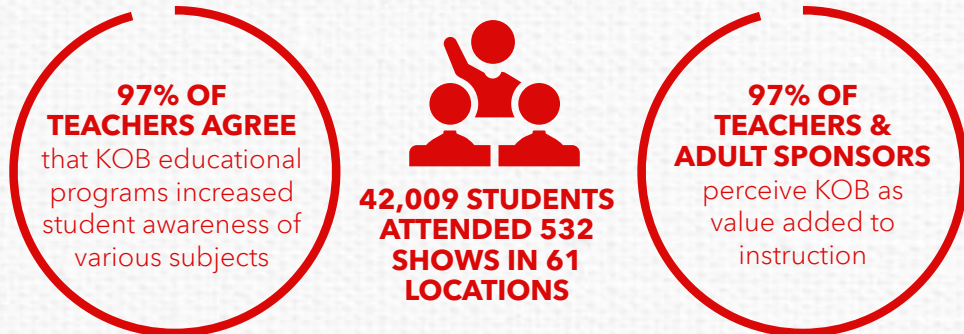

We focus on hope and healing to create pathways to safe and nurturing parenting.

Our core philosophy is that parents and children have the expectation the future will be bright. We strive to ensure that they have the knowledge and ability to achieve their goals. We nurture pathways to hope through the services we provide.

We reached **76,705** children and adults in 2017 through three levels of prevention services.

KIDS ON THE BLOCK



Kids on the Block is providing pathways to hope to teachers, counselors, and elementary school students to help them to better understand child abuse, bullying, divorce, feelings, and conflict resolution through educational puppet shows.

BRIGHT BEGINNINGS



Bright Beginnings is a pathway to hope to keep babies safe by delivering critical information to parents and caregivers of newborns before they are discharged from the hospital. Each family receives a bag filled with program information from a Bright Beginnings registered nurse. The information given is intended to prevent shaken baby syndrome, and to increase the bond between mother and child by stressing the importance of talking, singing, and reading to the baby.

TULSA FAMILY CONNECTS

NEW Program!Tulsa Family Connects, launched in the Fall of 2017, is a free program for residents of Tulsa County that provides in-home nurse visits to parents of babies born at Hillcrest Medical Center regardless of income. To learn more about program goals visit: www.tulsafamilyconnects.org

Our home visiting programs provide parents and caregivers of young children in-home parenting education to enhance the intellectual, social, and physical development of children. We help parents and caregivers create pathways of safe environments and nurturing parenting. 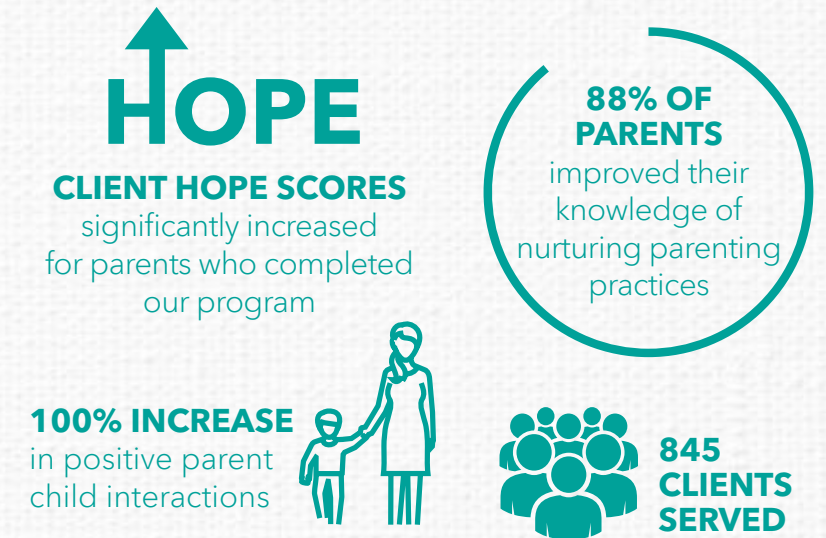
