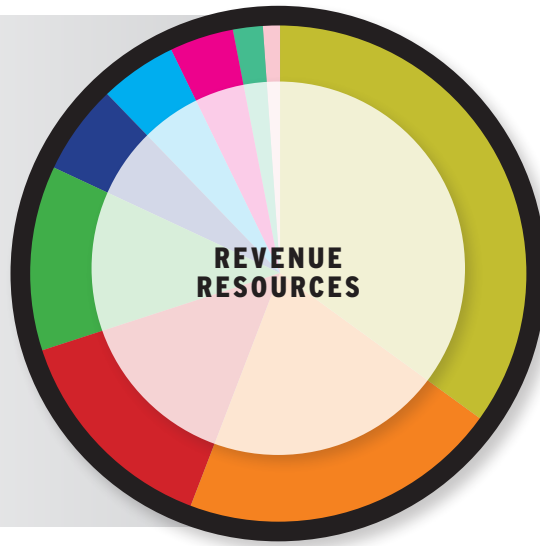
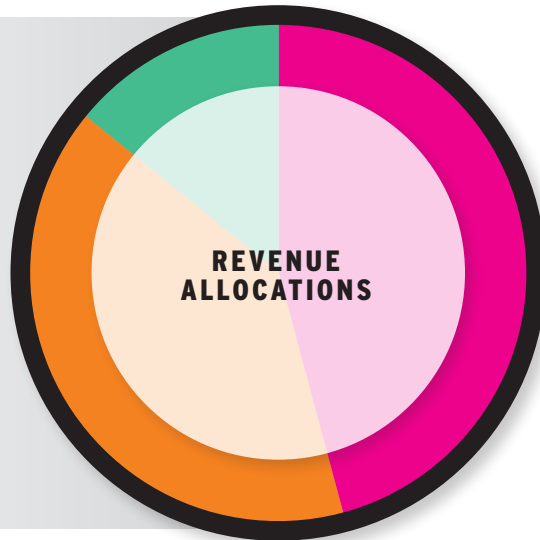


PCCT FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

OUR VISION

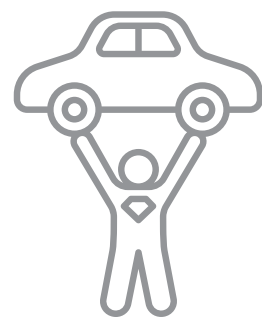

We reached **61,818** children and adults through three levels of child abuse and neglect prevention services.



PREVENTION THROUGH  
**COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

YOUTH PROGRAMS

Our Youth Programs ensure educators, administrators and other adults know how to keep children safe.

Our Kids on the Block (KOB) program teaches young children how to identify, report and cope with adverse experiences through puppetry.

- 19,434 students attended educational puppet shows



PCCT’s Anti-Bullying Collaboration (ABC) works to prevent bullying among children and youth. ABC’s goal is to equip children and youth with skills necessary to prevent bullying and other anti-social behavior in schools and the community.

BRIGHT BEGINNINGS

Registered nurses offer newborn education in all six Tulsa birthing

hospitals. New moms and other caregivers receive vital information about the prevention of shaken baby syndrome and the importance of promoting early brain development by talking, singing and reading to infants. PCCT has expanded to reach more males by providing education and resources in local barbershops.

- 37,040 adults received newborn education

PREVENTION THROUGH  
**FAMILY SUPPORT**

FAMILY SUPPORT

PCCT’s Family Support programs identify, mitigate and prevent risk for children by engaging with families in their homes. Parent educators provide education, support and referrals to resources.



- Nurses supported 1,906 new parents, caregivers, and newborns

TULSA FAMILY CONNECTS

Registered nurses visit new parents and caregivers in their homes after discharge from the hospital. Nurses share in the joy of a new baby, assess unique family risks and respond to immediate needs for support and guidance.



PARENTS AS TEACHERS

promotes the optimal early development, learning and health of children by supporting and engaging parents and caregivers in their homes.

- Parent educators served 421 adults and children



SAFECARE

is an evidence-based, in-home visitation program designed for parents experiencing high levels of stress. Parent educators work to improve parents’ skills in three areas: parent-infant/child interaction, health care and home safety.

- SafeCare staff provided support to 426 adults and children

PREVENTION THROUGH  
**THERAPY**

THERAPY

PCCT’s licensed professional therapists provide counseling support to families when there is an allegation or pattern of abuse and neglect, or when children have experienced trauma. The goal of these services is to prevent future



incidents of abuse and/or neglect in the current generation and stop the cycle of abuse across future generations.



- 1,003 adults and children received treatment services
